HMS Host Contract Win

Workers at HMS Host in the Sacramento Airport just bargained and won a life-changing contract. Some of the highlights include \$4+ raises for non-tipped workers, a paid Juneteenth holiday, and an addition of a tipline to all point-of-sales systems.



Thunder Valley Members had their First Bargaining Session

November 2024

On November 14, 2024, Your Union Committee and Union Representatives met with Thunder Valley Management for our first Negotiation Session for a new Union Contract.

In a very respectful and productive session, we proposed to extend the contract for 6 months in exchange for Raises, and management agreed!

\$1.10 for non-tipped and \$.55 for tipped starting on January 1, 2025.

Management agreed to make the unusual move of giving wage increases early to address inflationary pressures, to give us all time to fully bargain, and because the casino's contract with Sutter for health care expires at the end of 2025.
